***Revised Fee Structure For Under Graduate Courses in Engineering / Technology / Pharmacy / Architecture in Private/Self-financing Institutions in 2016-17***

The State Government in the Higher Education Department has examined the fee structure for the tuition fee chargeable by the private / self-financing Engineering & Technology Institutes of the State for the academic year 2016-17 as recommended by the Fee Structure Committee on 9<sup>th</sup> June, 2016.

After due consideration of all aspects of the matter including the socio-economic conditions of the State, the demand-supply situation in the private / self-financing higher education institutes offering Engineering & Technology courses, the number of seats remaining vacant in such institutes, etc., it has been decided to revise the fee structure notified vide this Department's order number:306-Edn(T)/10M-04/2004(Part IV), dated, 03.07.2015.

Hence, the Governor is pleased to fix the tuition – fee for students to be admitted in the under-graduate Engineering, Technology, Pharmacy and Architecture courses in the private/self-financing colleges in the State in the manner given below:

For the students admitted in First Year Engineering & Technology/Pharmacy/Architecture Courses in the Academic Year 2016-17.

I. Maximum Tuition Fee will be the following :-

**No separate Development Fee can be charged by the Colleges.**

- II. Besides Tuition Fee as prescribed above, Private/Self-financing Colleges may charge the following fees from the students admitted in the Academic Year 2016-2017:-
- a) One time Admission Fee not exceeding Rs.5000/- for entire Course period.
  - b) Library-cum-Book-Bank Fee not exceeding Rs.6000/- for the entire Course period.
  - c) Students Welfare, Sports and Games Fee not exceeding Rs.1000/- annually.
  - d) A reasonable amount as Refundable Caution Money.
  - e) Fees charged by the University for Welfare of Students and Development.
  - f) Other usual University Fees like Registration Fee, Examination Fee etc.
- III. Engineering Colleges which have obtained "Autonomous" status on or before the date of this order and the Engineering Colleges which have earned NBA accreditation for 2/3<sup>rd</sup> of eligible B.Tech or B. Pharm or B.Arch Courses on or before the date of this Order will be at liberty to charge higher Tuition Fee not exceeding 10% of the prescribed maximum General Tuition Fee only.
- IV. Colleges which have opted for and implemented the revised Tuition Fee Structure prescribed for the students admitted in 2013-2014, 2014-2015, 2015-2016 will continue to provide half-free-ship to 10% of the students admitted in each of the Engineering / Technology / Pharmacy / Architecture Courses in the academic session 2016-2017 during the entire course period, subject to their satisfactory academic performances.
- V. Colleges which have implemented the notified tuition fee structure prescribed for the students to be admitted in 2016-2017 will also provide half-free-ship to 10% of the students admitted in each of the Engineering/Technology/Architecture/Pharmacy Courses in the academic session 2016-2017 and during their entire course period, subject to their satisfactory academic performances.
- VI. No capitation fee in any form or kind can be demanded or realized from the students for admission or continuance of study in the colleges or for any other reason, either directly or indirectly.

- VII. No college shall demand or charge any other fee of Compulsory nature from the students.
- VIII. In case of any violation of or deviation from any condition or stipulation of this Fee-revision decision/order, Fee Structure Committee may itself take action or recommend appropriate action by the AICTE and / or the University and/or Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal, against violating Colleges / Institutions after giving opportunity of hearing to the concerned College/Institution.
- IX. Every college will submit a statement to the Affiliating University i.e. Maulana Abul Kalam Azad University of Technology by November 30, 2016 enumerating the type and amount of fees charged from the students admitted in the college, and the details of Tuition Fee concessions granted to students admitted in the academic session 2016-2017, while endorsing a copy of the same to the Director of Technical Education, West Bengal.

This Notification is issued in the public interest and in supersession of all previous Memoranda and/or Notifications issued by this Department on this subject.
